

Saving the Martyrs' Legacy

The former Chapel in the heart of Tolpuddle is internationally significant as the place where the Tolpuddle Martyrs preached and worshipped. It was built in 1818 as a Methodist Chapel and is listed Grade II* by Historic England. It is on their Buildings at Risk Register and we need your help to conserve it for future generations.



In February 2015 the Tolpuddle Old Chapel Trust (TOCT), a Building Preservation Trust, purchased the building and site and with funding from Historic England undertook emergency repairs.
