I am the Formal Learning Consultant for Tolpuddle Old Chapel Trust. It is my role to create an exciting and accessible learning programme which will engage local children and other visitors with the history of the building. As well as planning activities at the Old Chapel, I will also provide self-directed resources that can be used before and after visiting the site.

The Old Chapel is an amazing new resource for local schools - a direct link to 19th century Tolpuddle. A fantastic example of traditional cob building techniques, the Old Chapel is also a great starting point to explore the history of the Dorsetshire Labourers (later known as The Tolpuddle Martyrs), their Methodist faith and the harsh living & working conditions which drove them to challenge the status quo.

I hope children who visit the Old Chapel will connect to the past but also make links to their lives now. What is fair and unfair? What can we do if we feel unfairly treated? How can we fight against injustice in society? This small building is a wonderful example of how ordinary people took control of their lives and changed society for the better. I want a visit to the Old Chapel to be educational, inspiring but also lots of fun!
